

If you are looking for daily spiritual devotions/meditations that have some substance to them I highly recommend Richard Rohr's daily meditations. You can sign up on line for these free of charge at https://cac.org/category/daily-meditations/. In today's meditation (Monday, Feb. 26) he talks about how all things change and grow. He begins by saying, "It is hard for me to understand why some Christians are so threatened by the notion of evolution. Are they not observing reality? Why this stalwart attachment to inertness? Perhaps static things appear more controllable? I suspect such resistance largely comes from our ego and our unconscious."

This could be said about all things spiritual and theological. I have often wondered why persons more intelligent that I am get stuck in their beliefs and Christian experience. They have the same beliefs they had when they were young. And usually not much changes in their Christian experience as well. Why is there not more growth, evolution, and transformation? Often, these same persons accept change and growth quite well in all other areas of their lives. Maybe it's because all the areas of their lives are changing, sometimes quite rapidly, and so they cling to that "old time religion" that never changes because it offers some stability and security. Unfortunately, so often it an unhealthy and immature dependence.

traditions that would suggest God is as static as many of us are. God is not the "unmoved mover" of Aristotelian philosophy. God is rather the "most moved mover." Our relationship to God is like a dance, or should be.

Sometimes God takes the lead and we respond; sometimes we take the lead and God responds. And throughout this give and take, this call and response, we should be learning how to share God's passion and compassion, God's love and will for the world.

Christianity at-large is stuck today in so many ways. I hope we can swim against the current and be open to grow, learn, change, and become more like God, who is only changeless when it comes to God's unconditional love.
