Infant Resource Center 2nd Quarter 2018 Update

For the second quarter of 2018, the IRC served 13 families, 4 of whom were new to the IRC. In these families there were 13 children served, 7 of whom were new to the IRC. There were also 2 unborn babies served with car seats. The following items were provided to the families served during this quarter: 14 packages of diapers, 64 cloth goods items (such as lotion, baby wash, wipes, etc.), 4 cans of formula, 2 cribs and 2 crib mattresses, 1 pack 'n play and one mattress, 3 car seats, 2 bouncy seats, 2 baby bath tubs and various books and toys.
