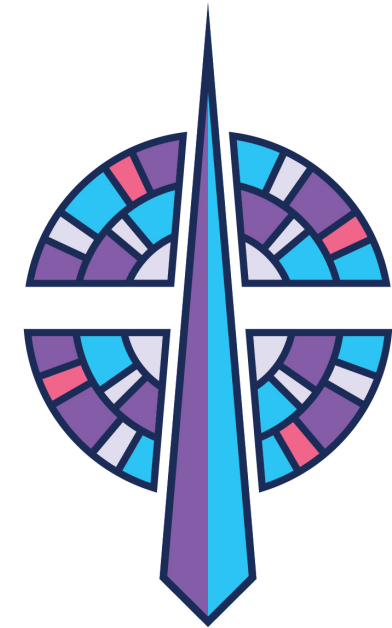

Acts 17:22-34
Women's Lectionary Translation

²² Now Paul stood in the center of the Areopagus and said, "Athenians, I see in everything how devout you are. ²³ For passing through and regarding objects of your worship, I found an altar with the inscription, 'To an unknown god.' What, therefore, you all worship as unknown, this is what I proclaim to you: ²⁴ The God who made the world and everything in it, the one who is Sovereign of heaven and earth, does not live in temples made by human hands. ²⁵ Neither is God served by human hands because of needing anything, since God gives to all life and breath and all things. ²⁶ From one person God made all nations, all persons [women, men, and children], to inhabit the face of the earth and God ordered seasons and the boundaries of their habitation, ²⁷ that they would search for God and perhaps reach for God and find God, yet indeed God is not far from any one of us.

²⁸ For 'In God we live and move and have our being'; just as some among your poets have said, 'For we too are the offspring of God.'

²⁹ "Since we are the offspring of God, we ought not to think that the divine is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the craft and creativity of women and men. ³⁰ At one time God overlooked ignorance; now God commands all women and men everywhere to repent. ³¹ For God has fixed a day on which God intends to judge the world in righteousness through a man whom God has appointed, giving assurance to all by raising him from the dead."

³² They heard of the resurrection of the dead. Some scoffed, yet others said, "We will hear you again about this." ³³ Thus Paul left from their midst. ³⁴ Now some joined him, believing, including Dionysius the Areopagite and a woman named Damaris, as well as others with them.
