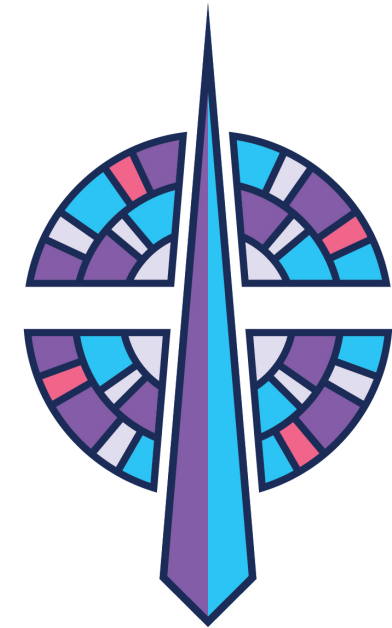

1 Timothy 6:6–16 Women’s Lectionary Translation	

⁶ Of course, there is great gain in godliness with contentment.
⁷ For nothing did we bring into the world, so there is nothing we can take out of it. ⁸ But if we have food and clothing, with these we will be content. ⁹ Now those who want to be rich fall into temptation and a trap. And many foolish and harmful passions plunge women and men into ruin and destruction. ¹⁰ For the root of all evil is the love of money, and some desiring [it] have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains.
¹¹ But as for you, child of God, shun all this; pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, gentleness. ¹² Fight the good fight of the faith; take hold of the eternal life, to which you were called and to which you professed the good profession in the presence of many witnesses.

¹³ I charge you in the presence of God, who enlivens all things, and of Christ Jesus, who in his testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good profession, ¹⁴ to keep the commandment without spot of blame until the appearing of our Redeemer Jesus Christ, ¹⁵ who God will reveal in God’s own time – God who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the Power beyond all powers and Majesty of majesties. ¹⁶ It is God alone who has immortality and dwells in light unapproachable, whom no human has seen or can see; to God be honor and everlasting might. Amen.

¹⁶ Someone came to Jesus and said, “Teacher, what good deed must I do to have eternal life?” ¹⁷ And Jesus said to him, “Why do you ask me about ‘goodness’? There is only one who is good. If you wish to enter into life, keep the commandments.” ¹⁸ He said to him, “Which ones?” And Jesus said, “*You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness;* ¹⁹ *Honor your mother and father; also, You shall love your neighbor as yourself.*” ²⁰ The young man said to him, “I have kept all these; what do I yet lack?” ²¹ Jesus said to him, “If you wish to be perfect, go, sell your possessions, then give to the poor, and you will have treasure in the heavens. Then come, follow me.” ²² When the young man heard this word, he went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

²³ Then Jesus said to his disciples, “Truly I tell you all, it will be hard for a rich person to enter the realm of the heavens. ²⁴ Again I tell you all, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the realm of God.” ²⁵ When the disciples heard this, they were greatly astounded and said, “Then who can be saved?” ²⁶ And Jesus looked at them and said, “For mortals it is impossible, but for God all things are possible.”

²⁷ Then Peter said to him, “Look, we have abandoned everything and followed you. What then will we have?” ²⁸ Jesus said to them, “Truly I tell you all, when everything is made new, when the Son of Woman is seated on the throne of his glory, you all who have followed me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. ²⁹ And everyone who has abandoned houses or sisters or brothers or mother or father or children or fields, for my name’s sake, will receive a hundredfold, and will inherit eternal life. ³⁰ But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first.
